





Dear Parishioners,

In our Gospel this week, Jesus shares two parables that teach us important lessons about the Kingdom of God. These parables highlight the growth and impact of God's Kingdom in our lives and in the world. The first parable is about a man who scatters seed on the ground and then watches it grow, even though he does not fully understand the process. This parable reminds us that the growth of the Kingdom of God is a divine work that goes beyond our human understanding. Just as the seed grows into a plant and eventually bears fruit, the Kingdom of God unfolds and expands in ways that may be unseen or unexpected to us. It emphasizes the importance of faith and trust in God's timing and providence.



The second parable is about a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds, yet it grows into a large plant, providing shelter for birds. This parable illustrates the transformative power of the Kingdom of God. Despite its seemingly small beginnings, the Kingdom has the potential to impact and influence the lives of many. It encourages us to have faith in the seemingly insignificant acts of love, kindness, and obedience to God, knowing that they can have a significant and lasting impact on others and contribute to the growth of God's Kingdom.

These parables invite us to reflect on our own role in the Kingdom of God. They remind us that we are called to be faithful in sowing seeds of love, mercy, and justice in our daily lives, trusting that God will bring about growth and transformation. They also challenge us to recognize the potential for growth and impact in seemingly small and humble acts of service and discipleship. We are invited to have faith in the growth and impact of God's Kingdom, even when we may not fully understand or see its workings. It encourages us to embrace our role as participants in God's redemptive work, knowing that our faithful efforts, no matter how small, can contribute to the growth and transformation of the world around us.

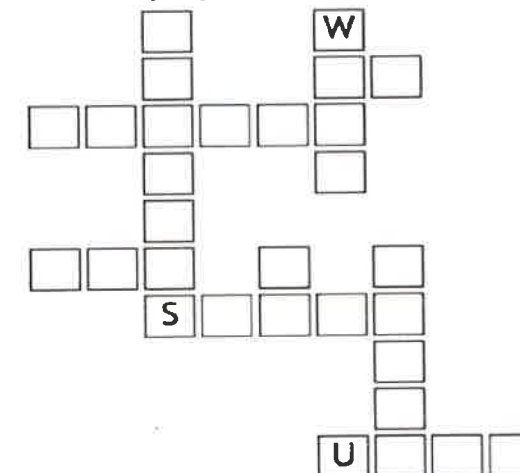
