

As I mentioned last week, we will be having our fall Festival October 6th at Stysh's Campground. This year we will be changing the time

In our first reading from Joshua, we encounter a pivotal moment in Israel's history, where Joshua gathers the tribes and challenges them to renew their covenant with God. This passage serves as a powerful reminder of the choices we face in our spiritual journeys. Joshua's call to choose whom they will serve resonates deeply with contemporary believers, urging us to reflect on our commitments and priorities.

Joshua stands before the people, recounting their history and God's faithfulness. He emphasizes the necessity of making a deliberate choice regarding whom they will worship—whether the gods of their ancestors or the Lord who led them from Egypt. This moment of decision underscores the importance of personal accountability in faith. It is not enough to inherit beliefs; one must actively choose to follow God.

In verses 15 and 16, Joshua declares, "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord." This declaration is both personal and communal, highlighting the influence of our choices on those around us. It invites us to consider the legacy we are creating for future generations. Are we leading them toward faith, or are we allowing distractions to pull us away from a relationship with God?

The people's response—acknowledging God's mighty acts and committing to serve Him—demonstrates the collective resolve to embrace faith. Their affirmation reflects the transformative power of remembering God's past deeds, which can inspire hope and commitment in our own lives. Ultimately, this passage challenges us to examine our own allegiances. In a world filled with competing priorities, we are called to make conscious decisions about our faith. Like the Israelites, we are invited to renew our commitment to serving the Lord, ensuring that our choices align with His purpose for our lives.

Food Pantry Corner


The St Patrick's food pantry has distributed 1239 meals for the month of July.
