

Mark 8:27-35 is a pivotal passage in the Gospel of Mark, revealing key elements of Jesus' identity and mission. This section begins



with Jesus questioning His disciples about public opinion regarding His identity. When asked, "Who do people say I am?" the disciples report various speculations, including that He is John the Baptist, Elijah, or one of the prophets. However, when Jesus directly asks, "But what about you? Who do you say I am?" Peter boldly declares, "You are the Messiah." This declaration is significant as it acknowledges Jesus' messianic identity, yet it is immediately followed by Jesus instructing His disciples not to tell anyone about Him (Mark 8:30). This "Messianic secret" motif is prevalent in Mark and serves to highlight the misunderstanding of Jesus' role.

The subsequent verses (Mark 8:31-33) demonstrate Jesus' teaching about the nature of His mission. He predicts His suffering, rejection, and death, emphasizing that the Messiah's path is one of suffering rather than political triumph. Peter's reaction—rebuking Jesus—illustrates the disciples' struggle to reconcile their expectations of a triumphant Messiah with Jesus' foretelling of suffering. Jesus responds sternly, indicating that Peter's perspective is aligned with human concerns rather than divine purposes.

Finally, in verses 34-35, Jesus articulates the cost of discipleship: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." This call to self-denial and bearing one's cross challenges the prevailing notions of power and success. It redefines what it means to follow Jesus, positioning discipleship as a radical commitment that may involve suffering and sacrifice.

In summary, Mark 8:27-35 encapsulates the essential themes of identity, suffering, and discipleship, urging readers to grapple with the true nature of following Christ in a world that often values comfort over commitment. How can we more closely follow Christ this week?

### **Food Pantry Corner**


The St. Patrick's food pantry has distributed 1470 meals for the month of August.
