Dear Parishioners,

This weekend, our first reading is taken from the book of numbers. Numbers 11:25-29 presents a pivotal moment in the wilderness journey of Israel, highlighting themes of leadership, prophecy, and the Spirit of God. In this narrative, the Lord takes some of the Spirit that rests on Moses and places it on the seventy elders, enabling them to prophesy. This event signifies the communal aspect of prophetic leadership and God's desire to empower others to share the burden of leadership with Moses.

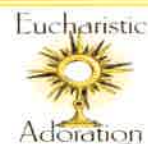


The passage begins with the Lord coming down in a cloud and speaking to Moses, a moment that underscores the intimate relationship between God and His chosen leader. By distributing the Spirit, God not only affirms Moses' leadership but also addresses the complaints of the people regarding the weight of their journey and their craving for meat, which they express with dissatisfaction. The elders' prophetic experience serves as a divine response to Moses' earlier plea for assistance in leading the people.

However, the narrative takes an intriguing turn with the mention of Eldad and Medad, who prophesy in the camp despite not being present at the designated gathering. Their actions provoke a response from a young man who expresses concern about their unauthorized prophesying. This moment raises important questions about the nature of authority and the inclusivity of God's Spirit. Moses' reaction is significant; he expresses a wish that all of God's people could be prophets. This reflects a prophetic vision where the Spirit is not confined to a select few but is available to all who seek to engage with God's will.

To sum up this reading, Numbers 11, 25-29 emphasizes the empowerment of community leadership through the Spirit, challenges traditional views of authority, and illustrates Moses' humble desire for widespread prophetic engagement among the people of Israel.
