

Dear Parishioners.

Mark 10:35-45 provides a profound insight into the nature of true leadership and service in the context of Jesus' teachings.



In this passage, James and John, the sons of Zebedee. approach Jesus with a request for prominent positions in His glory, seeking to sit at His right and left hand. This request reflects a common human desire for status and recognition. Jesus responds not with condemnation but with a teaching moment, highlighting the misunderstanding of greatness. He asks them if they are able to drink the cup He drinks and be baptized with the baptism He endures. This imagery symbolizes suffering and sacrifice, foreshadowing His impending crucifixion. James and John, perhaps unaware of the gravity of their request, affirm their willingness. Jesus acknowledges their future suffering but clarifies that the positions they seek are not His to grant; instead, they are reserved for those for whom they have been prepared.

As the other disciples overhear this exchange, they become indignant, revealing their own ambitions and competitive spirit. Jesus then calls them together and contrasts worldly leadership with His vision of greatness. He teaches that in the kingdom of God, true leaders are servants. This radical redefinition challenges the societal norms of power and authority, where lording over others is common. Instead, Jesus emphasizes that greatness is found in humility and selfless service.

The passage culminates in verse 45, where Jesus articulates His mission: "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life as a ransom for many." This statement encapsulates the essence of His ministry and the model for His followers. In essence, Mark 10:35-45 calls believers to embrace a life of service, reflecting Christ's sacrificial love and redefining their understanding of greatness in the light of the Gospel.
