

I want to take an opportunity to bring to everyone's attention, an insert in this weeks bulletin. This week you will find what is called



the "State of the Parish Report". Over the last few months IO have taken a lot of time to put this information together. With in this report, you will find a number of topics, some easier to see than others. One of the main topics that are a real concern of mine is the number of maintenance issues that have come up over the years at all of the church locations. As you know, like to be as transparent as I can with everyone regarding what needs to be done in the parish. Whether it is on a liturgical level or a maintenance level. You will note that this document gives a brief overview of our financial situation, a more detailed report of this was distributed a couple of weeks ago. If there are any questions on that please do not hesitate to reach out to me.

One of the issues that we need to talk in detail about is the risk management concerns. As you know, I do not like asking for money especially if it will not be used to properly. In the near future, I would like to have a couple of listening sessions/town hall meetings to discuss ideas to where we should go in the future. We are doing amazing in terms of financials, but I fear we are going to keep putting money into things and keep having things go wrong. When I say this, I am not saying that we are going to close anything at this time, but I want to make people aware of some of the issues that need to be addressed in the next year.

Some of the other topics that are covered in this document is an annual utility usage for each location, as well as reasons for modification or merging of locations. Again. I want to stress that we are not closing any of the churches at this time! What I want to do is simply make people aware of the various issues that are occurring in the three church locations and two cemeteries that we have. Please stay tuned for more information and when we will be scheduling any town hall meetings.
