

Father in heaven, may the faith you have given us in your son. Jesus Christ, our brother, and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit,

reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom. May your grace transform us into tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel. May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of Evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally.

May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us. Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven.

May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise for ever. Amen Dear Friends in Christ.

When we contemplate God's revelation to humanity we can look to the Scriptures in a particular way. There are many occasions of what is called



Theophany, which is defined as a visible manifestation of God to mankind. In the First Reading this weekend we hear of such an encounter: The LORD appeared to Abraham by the terebinth of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent... Looking up. Abraham saw three men standing nearby.

What is most interesting about the encounter is that Abraham seems to refer to three visitors as if they were one person:
"Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. ... Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." The three persons reply to Ahraham's request as though they are one: The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said."

Many Church Fathers see in this moment a foreshadowing of what would later be revealed as an encounter with the Holy Trinity, the three persons who are one God. In another Theophany, we recall that Moses, when he beheld the burning bush, received the revelation of the name of the one true God: "But," said Moses to God, "if I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your ancestors has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what do I tell them?" God replied to Moses: I am who I am. Then he added: This is what you will tell the Israelites: I AM has sent me to you. (Exodus 3:13-14)

The ultimate Theophany is the incarnation. When Jesus took on human nature He made present in the world the fullness of God's revelation to mankind. We read, at the beginning of The Letter to the Hebrews: In times past, God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he spoke to us through a son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe... (Hebrews 1:1-2)

Just as Moses was given a name that revealed something of God's nature, when Jesus came, He revealed a new name that made known to the world the mystery of the Holy Trinity. In fact, He sends forth the apostles telling them: "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit...

(Matthew 28:18-19)

When we enter the Church and dip a finger in the holy water font, we make the sign of the cross. This should be done reverently and thoughtfully because we are, in that moment, recalling that the sacrifice of the cross has made possible our union with the Holy Trinity. It is a good practice to make the sign of the cross whenever we find ourselves struggling with temptation and sin. By so doing we are reminding ourselves that we have been redeemed by the cross of Christ and that we are made for the glory of Heaven and eternal union with the Holy Trinity. Grace be with you all,
