

Dear Friends in Christ.

Just this morning (Thursday), we read the Gospel for the memorial feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits. In it is



found one of the most striking lines found in the Gospels: Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them, "If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." (Luke 14:25-27)

Does Jesus really expect us to hate the members of our own family? Of course not! We are mindful of the new commandment that Jesus gave us: I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35) Since God is love (1 John 4:8) He is the source of all love and He must be our first love. By being in a holy communion with God, we find the grace we need to be in a holy communion with oneanother.

In The Gospel this weekend, our Lord gives us the parable of the rich man who had a bountiful harvest. Jesus tells us how the rich man reasoned about what he should do with his bountiful harvest: 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!"' In the parable Jesus explains God's response to this r reasoning: But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

We are mindful of the words spoken by the prophet Isaiah: Can a mother forget her infant, be without tenderness for the child of her womb? Even should she forget, I will never forget you. See, upon the palms of my hands I have engraved you... (Isaiah 49:15-6) What matters to God is every human soul. We may well reflect on the wounds our blessed Lord received during His passion. Especially the wounds in His palms! He kept those wounds even after He had risen and He bears them still in Heaven: Then I saw standing in the midst of the throne and the four living creatures and the elders a Lamb that seemed to have been slain. (Revelation 5:6) When we attend holy mass, we become what we receive. We become a Holy communion with God and with all who have sought to be one with Him in love.


