

So often we encounter members of other Christian denominations that believe that we are saved by Faith Alone, or Sola Fides. It was



Martin Luther who first proposed this understanding of justification. He, and others had been scandalized by the practice of priests who would offer many masses in a given day and receive a cash stipend for each mass and grow wealthy. Eventually this practice would be corrected by the Church which now allows a priest, on most days, regardless of how many masses are said, to receive only one daily stipend.

Even so, Luther promoted his understanding of salvation and developed the doctrine of Sola Fides, which would eventually bring about the protestant reformation. He believed that the sacrifice of the mass and the other sacraments had no power to save. He saw these as works that, at best, were merely symbolic. He developed the doctrine, in part from what we hear in this weekend's Second Reading. Here, we encounter the faith of Abraham as recounted in the Letter to the Hebrews:

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; ... By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country... By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age -and Sarah herself was sterile—for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy.

Luther would develop the idea that, like Abraham we can be saved by faith alone. A key text he would use to further promote this belief derives from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans: the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from [works] the law... the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. ... all have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God. They are justified freely by his grace through the redemption in Christ Jesus... (Romans 3:20-24) It is important to note that Luther would add the word works to the text, giving it the sense that one is not saved by works but by faith alone. This interpretation fails to understand the point that St. Paul was explaining. Abraham could not be saved by the law, or works of the law, because Abraham lived long before the law had been revealed to Moses. We recall that Abraham, in his old age, would finally have a son, Isaac. Issac would then have a son, Jacob who would also be called Israel. Jacob, in turn, would have twelve sons who, in Egypt became the twelve tribes of Israel. Many years and generations after Abraham, Moses would lead the tribes of Israel to Sinai and finally receive the ten commandments and the law that the Israelites would ever after struggle to keep.

Nonetheless, we know that we are saved by both faith and the grace that comes to us through the sacraments or the works of the New covenant.
