Dear Friends in Christ,



In The Second Reading this weekend St. Paul exhorts Timothy, and us all ...**that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for every-one, for kings and for all in authority... This is good and pleasing to God our savior, who wills everyone to be saved and to come to knowledge of the truth. For there is one God. There is also one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as ransom for all.**

Because we are all anointed with the Spirit of Truth (see John 13:16) at the time of Baptism and Confirmation, we can all gain knowledge of the truth that leads to freedom from sin and union with God and one-another. Pope Benedict XVI spoke of this in an address to the International Theological Commission in 2012. He helps us to understand what is called the Sensus Fidei or the Sense of the Faith:

The Dogmatic Constitution Lumen Gentium teaches in this regard: “the whole body of the faithful who have an anointing that comes from the holy one (cf. 1 Jn 2:20,27), cannot err in matters of belief. This characteristic is shown in the supernatural appreciation of the faith (sensus fidei) of the whole people, when, ‘from the bishops to the last of the faithful’ they manifest a universal consent in matters of faith and morals” (n. 12).

In the believer this gift, the sensus fidei constitutes a sort of supernatural instinct which has a vital co- naturality with the object of faith itself. We note that the simple faithful carry with them this certainty, this firm sense of faith. The sensus fidei is a criterion for discerning whether or not a truth belongs to the living deposit of the Apostolic Tradition. It also has a propositional value for the Holy Spirit never ceases to speak to the Churches and to guide them towards the whole truth.

However, the Sense of the Faith is not the same as a majority opinion. Pope St. John Paul II, in his encyclical Familiaris Consortio (The Family in the Modern World) explains: The “supernatural sense of faith” however does not consist solely or necessarily in the consensus of the faithful. Following Christ, the Church seeks the truth, which is not always the same as the majority opinion. (Familiaris Consortio, #5)

We should all endeavor to be guided by the Spirit of truth and be united in the truth. Such unity becomes the means of discernment that helps us fulfill the mandate spoken by Christ right before He ascended to be with the Father: **Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.”** (Matthew 28:19-20) Grace be with you all,
