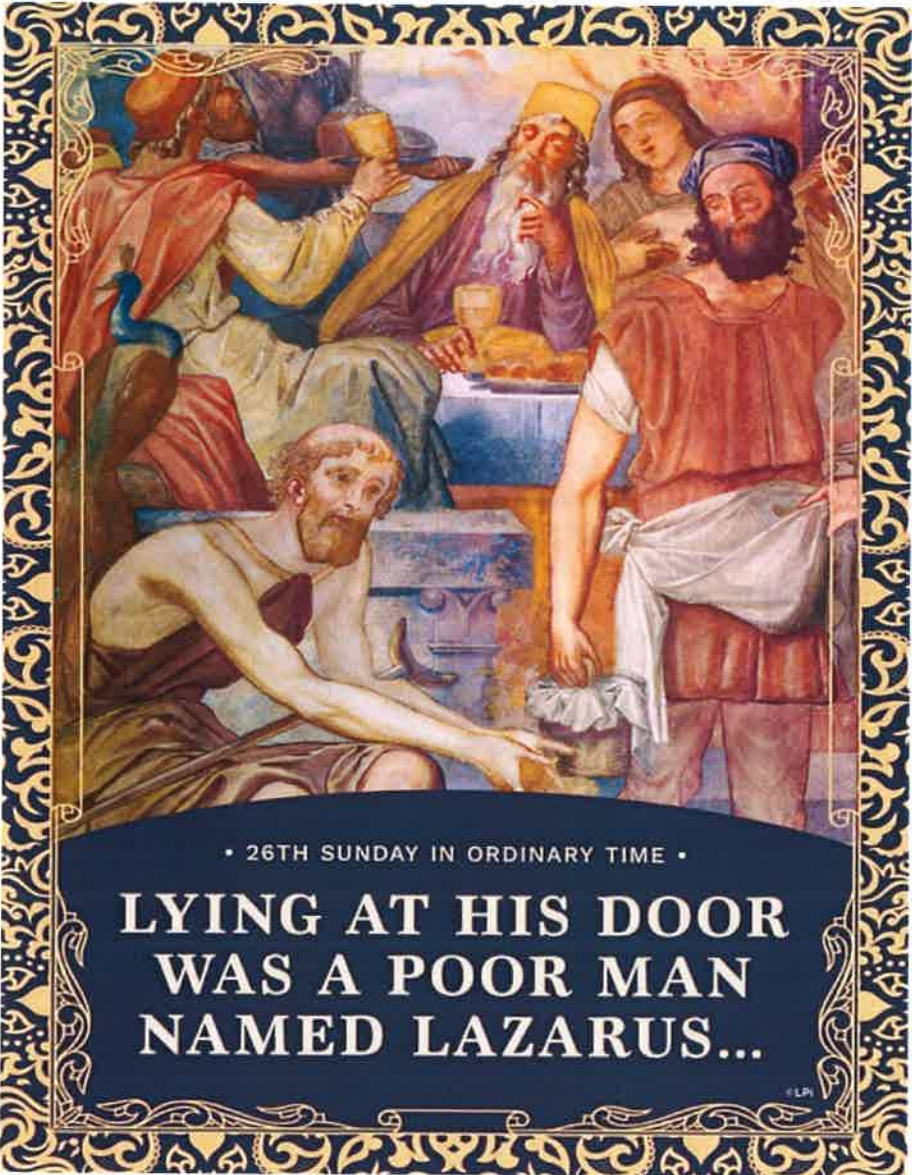

Dear Friends in Christ,



In The Gospel this weekend we hear the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. The end of the parable has an important proclamation: Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the prophets. Let them listen to them.' He said, 'Oh no, father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'"

It is no coincidence that the poor man in the parable is called Lazarus. In the Gospel of John, we hear of Lazarus, Mary and Martha and we recall that Lazarus took ill: Now a man was ill, Lazarus from Bethany, the village of Mary and her sister Martha. So the sisters sent word to him, saying, "Master, the one you love is ill." When Jesus heard this he said, "This illness is not to end in death, but is for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was.

It is an odd thing that the Gospel tells us that Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus and then goes on to explain that Jesus remained where He was for two days. What our Lord does in this Gospel is a foreshadowing of what He would do when He would endure His passion, die and then rise on the third day. Even though Jesus loved Martha, Mary and Lazarus, He was using the death of His friend to bring about a greater good.

When Martha goes out to meet Jesus when He finally arrives in Bethany He speaks to her about the hope of the resurrection: Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise." Martha said to him, "I know he will rise, in the resurrection on the last day." Jesus told her, "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" She said to him, "Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, the one who is coming into the world." (John 11:21,24-45)

When Jesus arrives at the tomb, we are told:...[Jesus] cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, tied hand and foot with burial bands, and his face was wrapped in a cloth. So Jesus said to them, "Untie him and let him go." Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.

Jesus allowed His friends to suffer so as to perform the miracle that would lead many to believe. Even so, we are told that many not all came to believe. Again we recall what Jesus says in the parable: "...neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead." Grace be with you all,
