

Dear Friends in Christ,

In The Second Reading this weekend we may discern an invitation to have renewed trust in the power of the Holy Spirit that



has been given to us: I remind you, to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control.

Even though St. Paul is writing to Timothy to remind him of the Spirit that was given through the laying of hands at the time of his ordination, we should all be mindful that our baptism and confirmation sealed each one of us with the gift of the same Spirit. Fr. John Harden, writing about the power of the Holy Spirit explains:

Christ promised not only His disciples, but us, that we would receive "power when the Holy Spirit comes on you." This power is not only for ourselves but for others that we, being strengthened, might witness to Him Who strengthens us. When Christ said, "You will be my witnesses," St. Luke, writing in Greek, used another word-"You will be my martyrs." We are bidden to witness as martyrs. How? By the way we live, which is the most eloquent witness we can offer. ... What good are all the treasures of heaven which Christ has conferred on us-His most beloved children and people of God-unless we use them? Here lies the difference between those who are good Christians but remain until death in mediocrity and those who strive for, and reach, sanctity. It is up to us! And, strange as it may seem, when God sees we appreciate the grace we have by using it, He gives us more. This is the secret of holiness-using the gifts that God gives in order that, having received, we may glorify the Giver. (Pentecost 1994 issue of The Catholic Home Educator)

Pope St. John Paul II, taught the following during the General Audience on Wednesday, August 12, 1987: He who believes in me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.' Now this he said about the Spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; ... Jesus announced the coming of the Holy Spirit by the use of the metaphor of "living water," because it is "the Spirit that gives life" (Jn 6:63). The disciples will receive this Spirit from Jesus himself in due course, when Jesus will be glorified. The evangelist has in mind the paschal glorification through the cross and resurrection.

Jesus, in The Last Supper Discourse in John's Gospel linked His going forth to crucifixion with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit: But I tell you the truth, it is better for you that I go. For if I do not go, the Advocate will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. (John 15:7) 15:7) Through prayer, especially in times of trial or temptation, we can all draw strength by calling forth the power of the Holy Spirit. Grace be with you all,
