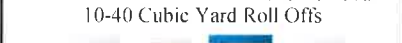


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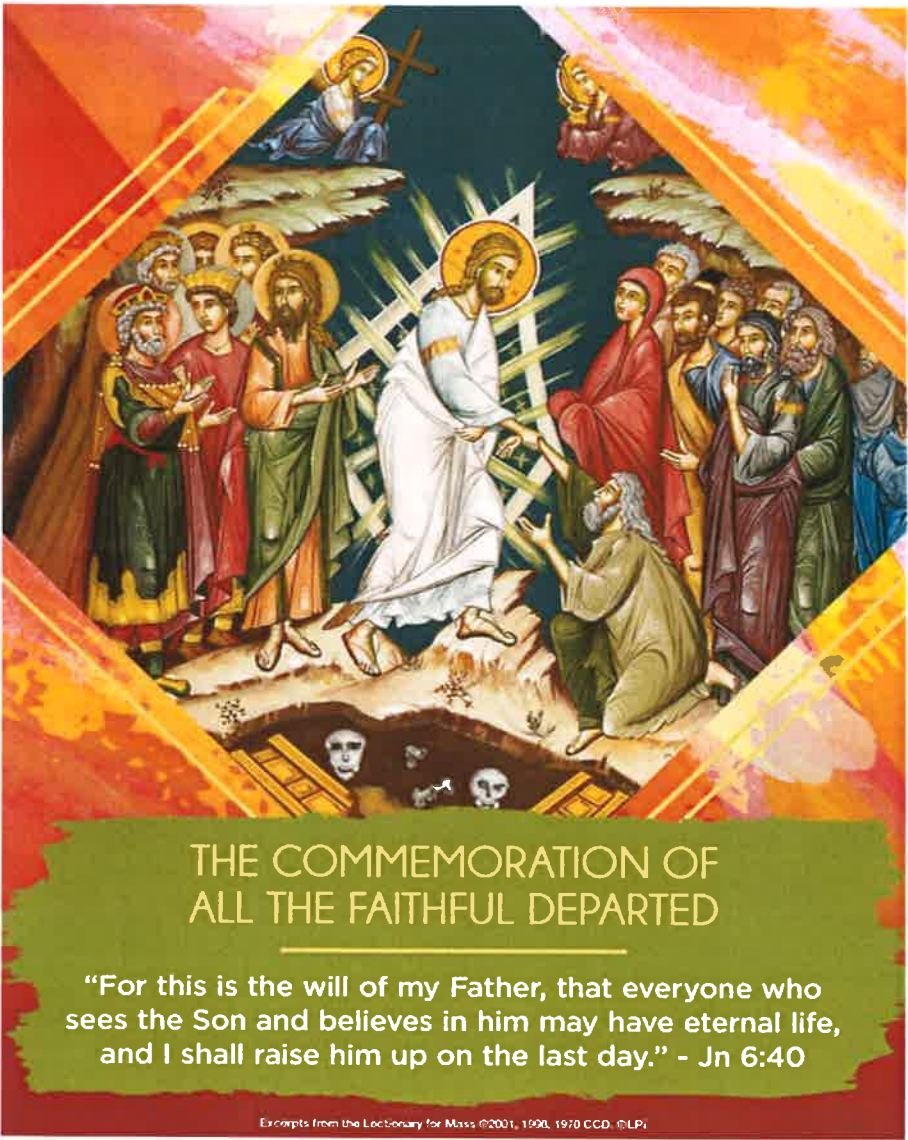

Dear Friends in Christ,



The celebrations this weekend are a
time for us to pray for All the Faithful
Departed. It comes the day after we
celebrate the Solemnity of All
Saints. The question may be asked: What is the distinction
between the faithful departed and the saints? It is a bit confusing
because we may think that the faithful departed, because they
were faithful, must be in heaven. Well then, if they are in heaven
are they not also saints? The confusion stems from belief that the
faithful departed go directly to heaven and, there is missing an
understanding of the doctrine of purgatory. In fact the liturgy for
All Souls is specifically for the souls that are in purgatory.
The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches:

All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly
purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after
death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness
necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name
Purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely
different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formu-
lated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils
of Florence and Trent. The tradition of the Church, by reference
to certain texts of Scripture, speaks of a cleansing fire... This
teaching is also based on the practice of prayer for the dead,
already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: "Therefore [Judas
Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be
delivered from their sin." From the beginning the Church has
honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers in suffrage
for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice, so that, thus purified,
they may attain the beatific vision of God. The Church also
commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance
undertaken on behalf of the dead. (CCC, #1030-1031)

One scriptural proof for the doctrine of purgatory is found in
St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians: According to the grace
of God given to me, like a wise master builder I laid a foundation,
and another is building upon it. But each one must be careful how
he builds upon it, for no one can lay a foundation other than the
one that is there, namely, Jesus Christ. If anyone builds on this
foundation with gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, or straw,
the work of each will come to light, for the Day will disclose it.
It will be revealed with fire, and the fire [itself] will test the
quality of each one's work. If the work stands that someone built
upon the foundation, that person will receive a wage. But
if someone's work is burned up, that one will
suffer loss; the person will be saved, but only as through fire.
(1 Corinthians 3:10-15)

At every mass, prayers are offered for the souls in purgatory.
When Eucharistic Prayer II is used, as it often is at daily mass, the
priest prays, after the consecration: Remember also our brothers
and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection,
and all who have died in your mercy: welcome them into the light
of your face. For this reason, it is good to have masses said for
loved ones who have passed in the hope that they will soon be
purified and granted access to the joy of heaven.

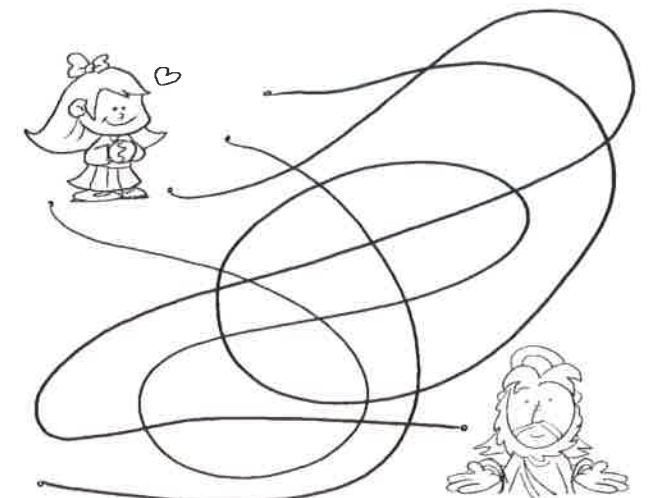
Please join us at Gill Hall on Tuesday evenings from
