

Dear Friends in Christ,



Quoting Karl Marx, Pope Benedict, before he was made pope, explained a false or erroneous idea of freedom that is widely followed in our own day: [freedom is understood as] the right and the opportunity to do just what we wish and not to have to do anything which we do not wish to do. (Truth and Freedom, by Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger) Later, in the same essay, Cardinal Ratzinger explains that: Freedom, if it is not to lead to deceit and self-destruction, must orient itself by the truth, that is, by what we really are, and must correspond to our being. (Ibid.)

As we celebrate The Baptism of the Lord, we are invited to contemplate the meaning and the effect of our own baptism. We should recognize that baptism defines our being and is the beginning of an authentic freedom. St. Paul, in his Letter to the Romans, helps us to understand baptism sets us on the path to true freedom:

What then shall we say? Shall we persist in sin that grace may abound? Of course not! How can we who died to sin yet live in it? Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?... For if we have grown into union with him through a death like his, we shall also be united with him in the resurrection. We know that our old self was crucified with him, ...that we might no longer be in slavery to sin. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as being dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus. For when you were slaves of sin, you were free from righteousness. But what profit did you get then from the things of which you are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. But now that you have been freed from sin and have become slaves of God, the benefit that you have leads to sanctification, and its end is eternal life. (Romans 6:1-3,5-6,8,20-22)

We know that Jesus, as is celebrated this weekend, was baptized by John at the Jordan. He also spoke of a second baptism that He was to endure: “I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!” (Luke 12:49-50) This second baptism refers to Christ’s own going down into death and then rising victorious from the grave. Our baptism, so long as we cooperate with its graces, unites us to the dying and rising of Jesus.

Our true freedom is made manifest when we die to sin and to the world and, united with Christ, die to ourselves and live for God and for the love of our neighbor.
