



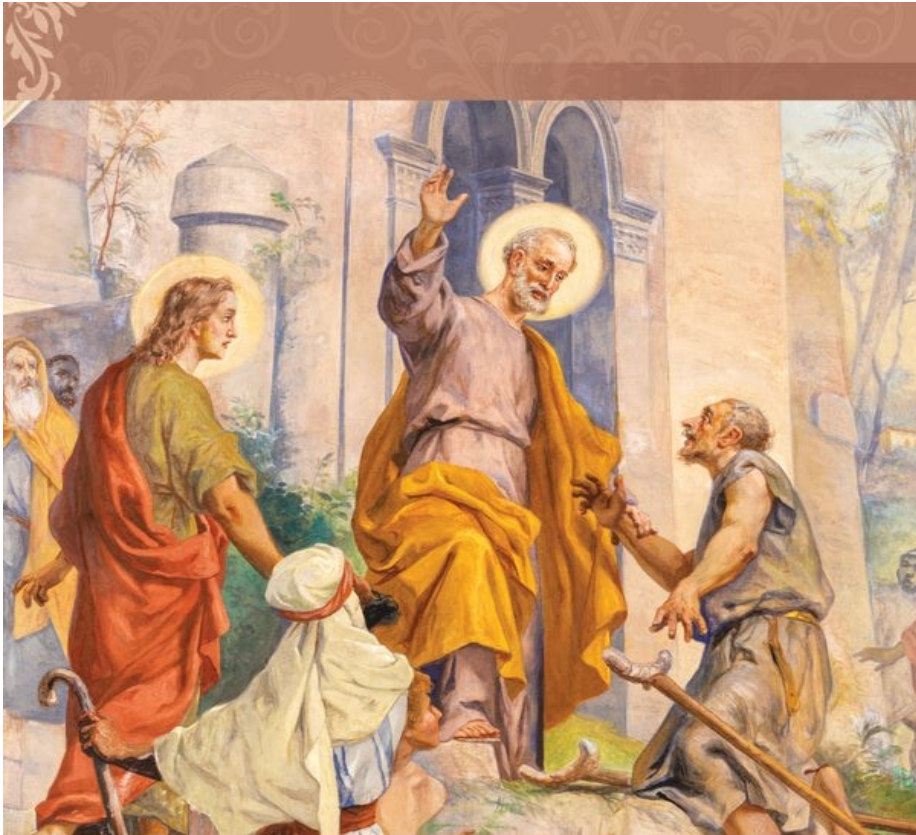

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In The First Reading Moses encounters the Lord while on Mount Sinai. He is told to explain to the people: You have seen for yourselves how I ...

brought you here to myself. Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."



We should be mindful that our baptism has made all of us participants in the priesthood of Christ. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains: Christ, high priest and unique mediator, has made of the Church "a kingdom, priests for his God and Father." The whole community of believers is, as such, priestly. The faithful exercise their baptismal priesthood through their participation, each according to his own vocation, in Christ's mission as priest, prophet, and king. Through the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation the faithful are "consecrated to be... a holy priesthood." (CCC, #1546)

We, therefore, all share in the priestly ministry first given to the original apostles. In The Gospel this weekend we hear of how the twelve disciples now became apostles. To be a disciple is to be one who is called to follow, while an apostle is one who is sent: ...He summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. After He summons or calls them, He then sends them forth after naming them: The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them...

The Catechism helps us understand the distinction between baptismal priesthood and ministerial priesthood: The ordained ministry or ministerial priesthood is at the service of the baptismal priesthood. The ordained priesthood guarantees that it really is Christ who acts in the sacraments through the Holy Spirit for the Church. The saving mission entrusted by the Father to his incarnate Son was committed to the apostles and through them to their successors: they receive the Spirit of Jesus to act in his name and in his person. The ordained minister is the sacramental bond that ties the liturgical action to what the apostles said and did and, through them, to the words and actions of Christ, the source and foundation of the sacraments. (CCC, #1120)

THIRD: against the Divine Maternity, refusing, at the same time, to receive her as the Mother of mankind.

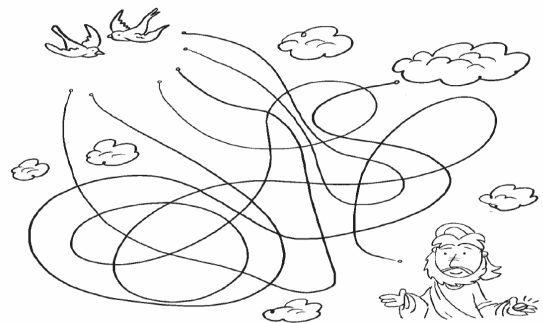
FOURTH: those who seek publicly to implant, in the hearts of children, indifference, disrespect and even hate for this Immaculate Mother.
